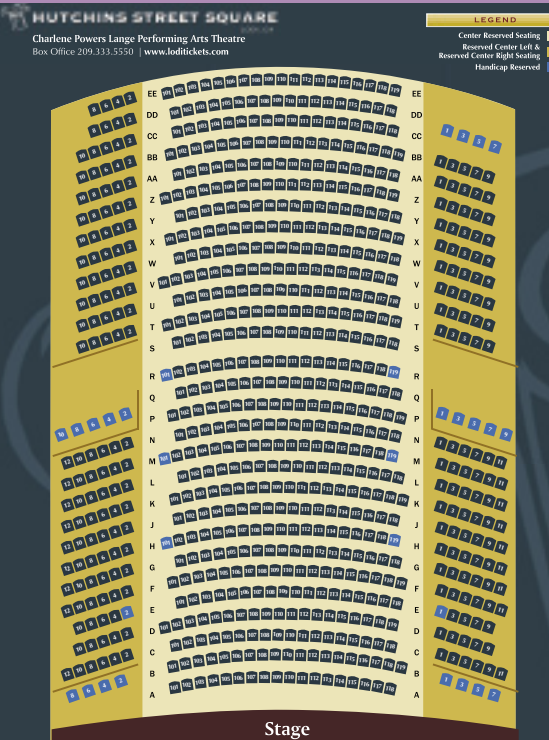

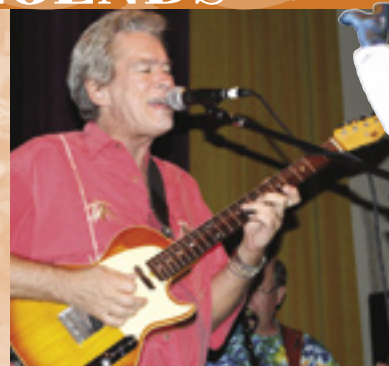
**SHAOLIN WARRIORS** **Mon, Oct 15, 6:30pm**

The Sons of Champlin are a veteran rock group started in Marin County in 1965. The Greatful Dead's Mickey Hart calls them "the most talented of all the (sixties) bands." R&B and jazz musicians, the Sons released seven albums between 1968 and 1977. After a twenty-year hiatus, they reunited for a series of successful gigs. In 2002 they were back in the recording studio and touring on stage. Carmen Grillo, formerly of Tower of Power, is the band's newest member.

From the state of Veracruz, Mexico, the renowned Trio Los Panchos continues the tradition of its earlier members, who in the 1940's internationalized popular ballads, love songs and boleros from Mexico, Cuba and Central America. Still considered one of the foremost Latin vocal groups today, Trio Los Panchos takes the audience on a journey down *Memory Lane* with melodies that capture the passion and beauty of Hispanic culture.
